

Pilgrim History "Trivia"

A few "firsts" during John Howland's life from
The Life and Times of John Howland exhibit.

- *Romeo and Juliet* was first performed, 1595
- The first merry-go-round was seen at a fair in Philippopolis, Turkey 1620
- First record of bottled water was in the United Kingdom at Holy Well Spring, Malvern 1622
- First Tavern in America opened by Samuel Cole in Boston, 1634
- The first mint in America established by John Hull in Boston, 1652
- Samuel's daughter's dowry was her weight in Pine Tree Shillings
- Rhode Island enacts first law declaring slavery illegal, 1654
- In New Amsterdam, the first police force was formed, 1658

New & Interesting Trades

GUILD DICTIONARY OF ARTS AND TRADES

Please add these trades to your Guild Dictionary. The Guild is always happy to receive new trades for existing or new ancestors. A trade must be defined as it would have been recognized in Colonial days versus how it may have evolved and been used thereafter. A great deal of research and discussion goes into the process.

FINER - highly skilled iron worker Smith (S)

JESTER - a professional joker, an entertainer Arts (A)

MINER - one who extracts ore/minerals from the earth Smith (S)

PITCH-TAR WORKER - one who processed trees for resin and/or worked in the application of pitch and tar; a part of the Naval Stores industry Wright (W)

ROSIN MAKER - one who processed products derived from the resin of pine trees and plants; part of the Naval Store industry..... Wright (W)

NAVAL STORES PRODUCER - one who processed products derived from the resin of pine trees or plants. The historical term “naval stores” dates to the days of sailing ships when wood had to be sealed and caulked with resinous products. Wright (W)

OATMEAL MAKER - (1) one who ground oats into meal; (2) one who made oatmeal for the purpose of selling it to others (this does not include housewives, taverns, etc.). Provisions (P)

TURPENTINER - one who gathered sap from trees and distilled the resin into turpentine; a part of the Naval Store industry..... Wright (W)
